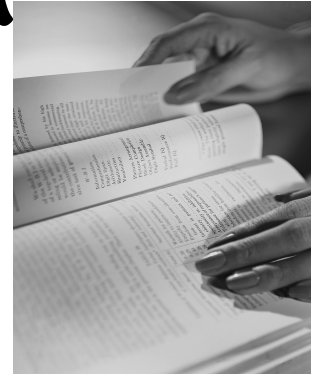
Prayers for the church, nation, and world:

Transformation Journal

October 3, 2010



Inviting you to daily time with God.

Every day the Transformation Journal will offer you a scripture passage and a question or two for reflection. Take a few minutes each day, and see what God has for you! The prayer list is also on the back, so please take time to pray for those we have lifted up on Sunday.

Sunday, October 3rd

Sermon Notes:

What leads us to living boldly for God?

Read 2 Timothy 1:1-14. Paul calls Timothy to boldness in living out the gift that God had given Timothy for ministry. How has God gifted you to reach out to the people around you? What would it look like for you to live boldly in that gift?

Monday, October 4th

Read Esther 4. Esther could have talked herself out of approaching the king, but instead she embraced the role that God had put her in that position to accomplish. What unique ways can you be bold for God because of your life situations? Do you talk yourself out of them?

Tuesday, October 5th

Read 1 Corinthians 15:1-20. Where are you on the spectrum between “the resurrection is not true and I don’t want to share it” and “the resurrection is true and the most important message I could share”? If you believe that it is true and important, why wouldn’t you share it?

Wednesday, October 6th

Read Ezekiel 4. Imagine how people today might respond to an individual acting in this way. Would you be willing to declare a prophetic word in a manner similar to Ezekiel? What would you be willing to do to declare the word of God to the people around you?

Thursday, October 7th

Read Daniel 3. How do you react to the willingness of these three men to die rather than worship an idol (v. 18)? What kind of faith stands up to a death threat without even seeking to argue (v. 16)?

Friday, October 8th

Read Psalm 146. Think about what you put your trust in on a day-to-day basis. Where does God fit? What is one step you can take this week to actively trust God more?

Saturday, October 9th

Read Judges 7. Gideon trusts God’s word enough to send home the majority of his troops on the eve of battle. Has God ever called you to do something this reckless to test your trust? How did you respond?

Sunday, October 10th

As we gather for worship, prepare your heart by focusing on God and offering this prayer: **“Living God, as we gather to worship you today, help me to encounter you, to truly worship you, to hear from you and to have my life changed by you. In Jesus’ name, Amen.”**
